**THE APPLICATION PROCESS**

Application forms can be accessed on-line from the above website. Application forms are also available by post from the Office of the Registrar on payment of Rs.1500/- for candidates applying from India. Candidates applying from SAARC countries Rs.3000 or its equivalent and for those from other countries US \$ dollars 100 or its equivalent. Pay as indicated below and **send the DD, the Chalan or receipt to: The Office of the Registrar, CMC, Thorapadi PO, Vellore 632002. State your full postal address with Pin-code. Mention your telephone number and email address if available.** No additional money, stamps or envelopes are required.

2. Take a printout of the form
3. Check the details for correctness. Paste a recent photograph (passport size) on it and sign the form.
4. Make your PAYMENT in one of the methods mentioned on page 1
5. Send in the signed form with proof of payment and other required ENCLOSURES to the Registrar, CMC, Vellore 632002 to reach on or before the last date.
6. An acknowledgement with a registration number will be mailed to you.
7. Keep the application number and registration number in hand to access your hall-ticket.

Application can also be submitted using the form provided for this purpose, together with the following enclosures.

1. Application form duly filled in. Please read carefully all the instructions before filling this form. Care should be taken not to fold, deface or dirty it. THE INFORMATION PROVIDED ON THE APPLICATION FORM WILL BE TAKEN AS FINAL.
2. Acknowledgement card with your address and other details duly filled in and Rs.6/- stamp affixed. Please keep your application number and Registration number safely to access your hall ticket and results from the website.

**NOTE:****1. CANDIDATES MAY APPLY FOR NOT MORE THAN ONE COURSE.**

2. Enclose Self-attested and clear photo copies (where applicable) of:
  - a) Certificate of completion of Sponsorship obligation
3. All foreign students require a “No Objection Certificate”, from The Secretary, Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi –110 011 after offer of admission to the College.
4. Ensure that the application form is complete.
5. Completed applications with all the required enclosures must reach the Registrar, Christian Medical College, Vellore – 632 002, before 5.00 p.m. on 23rd April 2007. **APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER THIS TIME LIMIT WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED. APPLICATIONS THAT LACK ANY ONE OR MORE OF THE ENCLOSURES BEYOND THIS TIME LIMIT WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.**
6. Candidates are advised to submit their applications as early as possible. Applicants employed in Government or similar establishments who have to route their applications through “proper channels” for the purpose of sponsorship/ permission/ leave, etc., are advised to submit an application as detailed above for the desired course, complete with all the required enclosures directly to the Registrar before the closing date. A photocopy of the completed application may be routed through the “proper channels”. This would avoid rejection of the application from such candidates due to receipt after the closing date on account of delays in various sanctioning offices.

**ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:**

**a) Degree of Doctor of Medicine (D.M.) Higher Specialities:**

A Candidate can be considered for admission to the above courses if he/she has passed MD General Medicine or Paediatric Medicine from T N Dr. M G R Medical University or any other University recognized by it and Medical Council of India.

- For D M Clinical Haematology – MD Pathology candidates are also eligible to apply
- For DNB Endocrinology – MD Obstetrics & Gynaecology candidates are also eligible to apply.

**b) Degree of Master of Chirurgy (M.Ch.) Higher Specialities:**

A Candidate can be considered for admission to the above courses if he/she has passed the M.S. in General Surgery from the T N Dr. M G R Medical University, or any other University, recognized by it and the Medical Council of India.

**c) 5 year MCh in Neurosurgery:**

1. Candidates having qualified for the M.B.B.S Degree of Madras University or any other University recognised as equivalent by the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University and the Indian Medical Council and obtained full registration and having completed their compulsory rotating residential internship before the starting date of the courses, are eligible to apply.
2. Those with a service obligation will need to have completed the same by the stipulated date of joining.
3. Candidates who are currently doing a PG degree may not be considered for admission to the 5 yr MCH Neurosurgery course.

**Candidates who have passed any qualifying exam, other than the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, University of Madras, Bharathiar University, Bharathidasan University & Madurai Kamaraj University shall obtain an eligibility certificate from the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University prior to admission.**

**Rules governing Sponsored candidates:**

Candidates who were sponsored for the M.B.B.S /Diploma/Degree courses in this institution and are now applying for postgraduate course will be governed by the following regulations:

- a) They should have fulfilled their obligation to serve the sponsoring body for periods as under, before the postgraduate courses begin:
  - Students sponsored for M.B.B.S./Diploma courses – 2 Years
  - Students sponsored for P.G. Degree courses – 3 Years
- b) They must submit with their application, a copy of the sponsorship obligation completion certificate issued by the appropriate authority of the sponsoring body, which must state the dates of commencement and completion (or expected date of completion) of obligatory service as well as the period and categories of their leave allowed and availed.
- c) Any candidate who was sponsored to the M.B.B.S. course in this institution is required to serve the concerned sponsoring body for a period of not less than two years before being considered for selection to any postgraduate



course. Any remaining service period in excess of two years that may have been agreed upon towards sponsorship for the M.B.B.S. course may be completed at a later date with the written permission of the sponsoring body, provided the candidate is re-sponsored for the postgraduate course by the same sponsoring body.

- d) When a candidate is sponsored for admission to a Higher speciality postgraduate course, the candidate must sign an agreement to serve the sponsoring body for a period of three years following the completion of that course. If the sponsoring body is unable to utilise the service of such a candidate, the College will reserve the right to utilise the candidate's obligatory service.

The service obligation for sponsorship should only be in terms of service and not financial compensation. However, if a sponsored student seeks relief from the service obligation agreement due to extra ordinary circumstances, the request will be considered on merits. **Marriage, securing a job outside the country or being selected for a postgraduate course elsewhere are not considered extraordinary circumstances. Students who do not fulfil the service obligation will not be eligible for admission to postgraduate studies or appointment as the staff of Christian Medical College, Vellore. They will not be given any certificates other than those statutorily mandated by the University and Indian Medical Council.**

- e) Candidates sponsored to postgraduate courses should have served a minimum period of two years at any position in one or more mission hospitals of any of the supporting bodies of this institution after graduation.
- f) Sponsorship will be on the basis of the need of the Sponsoring Body to have trained personnel for their Mission work. The Sponsoring body must give an undertaking that the speciality exists or will be created and also ensure that a post will be available when the candidate graduates.  
NO FEES OR DONATION are to be paid for this other than the stipulated sponsorship fee, which should not exceed Rs.250/-.
- g) In exceptional cases of need, the sponsoring body may recommend to the College to consider selecting a candidate for a postgraduate course at an earlier date, postponing the service obligation arising out of sponsorship for a Diploma/MD/MS course. Such a request will be reviewed by a committee consisting of the Director, Principal and Medical Superintendent. They will communicate their decision to the Selection Committee.

## THE SELECTION PROCESS

The selection of candidates for postgraduate courses will be according to the directives of the CMC Vellore Council.

Fifty percent of the seats in each course are reserved for sponsored candidates, provided they fulfil other criteria for eligibility for admission. However, more than 50% of the available seats may be allotted to sponsored candidate based on their ranking in the selection test. The wait list is based on ranking in the selection tests. The first sponsored candidate on the waiting list will ordinarily fill vacancies arising by sponsored candidates not accepting a seat to make up 50% reservation for sponsored candidates. In the event that more than 50% of the seats in any course are filled by sponsored candidates and one of the sponsored candidates does not accept the seat, it will be offered to the next candidate on the wait list by rank irrespective of whether he or she is sponsored or open.

No admissions will be made to the University courses after 30<sup>TH</sup> September 2007. Candidates for the DipNB courses may continue to be admitted until the last date specified by the National Board of Examinations PROVIDED they are not vacating another University registered seat.



## HALL TICKETS

The Hall Ticket is generated and available at the same website after 13 May 2007. Please access this and print it out. Check for accuracy of detail. Those applying on paper may also access this using their application and registration numbers. Hall tickets will only be posted to those who apply on paper. In case of non-receipt or availability of the hall ticket one week prior to the date of the written test, candidates may contact the Office of the Registrar by post, fax, email or the telephone. Please keep your application/registration number handy.

## ENTRANCE TESTS (See also Annexure 1)

Candidates for all Medical Higher Speciality courses conducted by the College are ranked on the basis of a written test, clinical and interview.

1. The written test will be conducted at Bengaluru, Chennai, Delhi, Ernakulam, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Lucknow, Madurai, Mumbai, Salem, Trivandrum and Vellore.
2. The written test paper consisting of multiple choice questions in the speciality for which candidate has applied.

The duration of the paper is 1 1/2 hours (120 questions). The entrance exam commences at 9.00 a.m. All candidates who wish to take the written test are required to be in their assigned seats at the time, date and place stipulated on the Hall ticket. No candidate will be permitted to enter the examination hall after 30 minutes of the stipulated examination commencement time.

**PLEASE NOTE: Candidates applying for the 5 year MCh course in Neuro-surgery will have to write a 3 hour paper(240 questions).**

**For those taking the exams in Vellore:** Please note that accommodation will not be available in the Hospital Annexe or any of the institutional guest houses or hostels during this period for candidates.

## RESULTS:

## INTERVIEW AND PRACTICAL TESTS:

A list of those candidates who are selected and are eligible for the tests and interviews will be put up on notice boards in the College and Town campuses and on the website <http://home.cmcvellore.ac.in/admissions/admin.htm>. Please refer to the time table on Page 1. The Tests and Interviews will usually be conducted at the Town campus (hospital), located on Ida Scudder Road, Vellore town.

Candidates who are invited to be interviewed must have the following documents in original:  
(Attested photocopies of the certificates are acceptable only for interview purpose)

- a) Degree Certificate or Provisional Pass Certificate or Official Final Mark Sheet issued by the University, for each course done – MBBS AND MD or MS.

**CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY OTHER AUTHORITIES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE**



- b) Course and Conduct Certificate issued by the Principal/Dean of the College and stamped with the Seal of office giving the dates of commencement and completion of the course, stating clearly that the candidate does not have any pending obligation of service - one certificate for each course done M.B.B.S. or Diploma or Degree. ***CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY OTHER AUTHORITIES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.***
- c) STATE MEDICAL COUNCIL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE (Temporary or Permanent). ***CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY OTHER AUTHORITIES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.***

All selected candidates who wish to accept the postgraduate seat offered, must give their acceptance in writing by the date and time stipulated in the Selection Notice.

All selected candidates must report to the Principal's Office to register themselves for the postgraduate course for which they have been selected as per time-table on page 1. All selections are subject to applicable regulations by University / Government and the Medical Council.

All documents should be submitted in Original at the time of Registration. The medical check-up may be completed and the medical fitness certificate should be brought for registration. The courses will commence on **1<sup>st</sup> August, 2007.**

**NOTE: ALL POST GRADUATE TRAINING IN THIS INSTITUTION IS IN-SERVICE TRAINING ONLY.**

**REGISTRATION OF SELECTED CANDIDATES:**

All selected candidates are expected to join their respective courses on the stipulated date without fail after registration. **Failure to join the course on the stipulated date** will lead to automatic forfeiture of the seat offered and the candidates in the waiting list (in the order listed) will be invited to join the course.

**Original Certificates including the following are required to register for admission:**

- a) M.D/M.S. Courses and conduct certificate in original issued by the Principal / Dean in the case of D.M./M.Ch. Courses. (other than 5 year M.Ch Neurosurgery courses.)
- b) M.B.B.S Course and conduct certificate issued by the Principal/Dean for 5 year M.Ch. Neurosurgery courses.
- c) Internship Completion Certificate in the case of graduates of Universities other than the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University.
- d) Eligibility Certificate obtained from the Registrar, The Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University if they are graduates of other Universities.
- e) A certificate of date of birth
- f) Sponsorship obligation completion certificate in the case of former sponsored students of this college.
- g) Diploma Certificate for those who have completed diploma in the subject.
- h) Foreign nationals must submit a no objection certificate (to undergo the course) issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.
- i) Tamil Nadu Medical Council registration certificate.

Tuition fees of the whole course must be paid as one instalment at the time of registration.



**Last date for Registration:** The last date for registration of candidates called in from the waiting list will be **30.9.2007** for DM / MCh courses.

**WITHDRAWALS:**

Last date for withdrawal from Higher Speciality courses 31/08/2007.

Candidates who accept the offer of selection and join the course will be expected to *complete the whole training period*. *If due to any extra-ordinary circumstances a candidate is forced to discontinue, the desire to withdraw should be notified to the Principal in writing by 15 September 2007.*

Wait listed candidates should keep the Office of the Registrar updated about the contact address and phone number up to 30/09/2007. Those who withdraw from the course thereafter will not be selected for any training course or staff appointment subsequently in this institution. They will be required to pay the fees for the full course and make compensatory payment at the rate of the stipend normally paid to them, an amount that is proportionate to any shortage of notice for withdrawal that is less than one month. Tuition fee and University Registration fee once paid will not be refunded.

**STIPEND & ACCOMMODATION:**

The medical postgraduate courses are conducted in accordance with the regulations of the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University and the training is of an “in service” type. Selected candidates will be paid a consolidated stipend (currently Rs.7750/- per month) as per rules, and provided free partly furnished single accommodation as per availability.

**SOME FACILITIES AVAILABLE FOR POSTGRADUATE TRAINEES:**

**Medical Records Department:** In clinical areas, special emphasis is given to medical record keeping. There is a well organised Medical Record Library in the institution as well as a departmental record system. Facilities are provided in these areas for trainees to conduct retrospective case studies from records.

**Research activity of each Department:** The Christian Medical College supports an active medical research programme. To broaden this experience, the trainee is encouraged to participate in research activities.

A Research Methodology course will be conducted for all newly selected postgraduate students. Attendance for this is mandatory. Failure to do so will result in the candidates forfeiting the privilege of obtaining research grants from the CMC Research Committee.

**Accommodation:** Partly furnished single accommodation in the hospital premises is provided for all postgraduate students. Candidates are required to vacate their accommodation within 2 weeks of finishing their course. Meals can be obtained from the canteen run by the National Y.W.C.A. in the hospital premises, or from one of the many hotels in the vicinity of the hospital. Meals can also be had either from the mess run at the Men Intern’s Quarters or Lady Doctor’s Hostel.

**Recreation:** Facilities for tennis, badminton, basketball, volleyball and table tennis are available



**Student/Staff Health Clinic :** The medical needs of the students and staff of the Christian Medical College are met through the clinic provided for this purpose. **Hepatitis B Vaccination is mandatory for all students.** The selected candidates should contact the Staff/Student Health Service within one week of joining the course. The candidates have to pay for the Vaccination (3 doses and 1 booster dose). Failure to take the Vaccination will make the candidate ineligible for free immunoglobulin in the event of accidental exposure of Hepatitis-B. If the candidate has already been vaccinated elsewhere the serum antibody titres should be confirmed through the Staff Students Health Services. The candidates have to pay for this test.

### FEES

All Candidates should pay the following fees at the time of registration for the course:

The fees will be collected for the whole course as one instalment, at the time of registration. University examination fees will be collected at the time of filling the examination form.

**ANNEXURE 1****INFORMATION ON ENTRANCE TESTS**

- The entrance tests are all of the 'objective' or multiple choice answer type, and can be of 3 different types (see examples at the end). There will be questions printed in the test booklet. Each question will have five possible answers (A, B, C, D & E) printed after it. Your task will be to select the one best answer to each question. There will be **ONLY ONE CORRECT ANSWER** to each question.
- In the answer sheet, the serial numbers of each question will be printed and against each number, there will be oval boxes provided for you to shade the correct answer .
- Remember that you should shade only one answer for each question. If you shade more than one answer for any question, you will not be given any credit for it even if one of your answers is correct.
- If you want to change your answer, be sure to erase your wrong answer completely with an eraser and shade the correct oval box.
- You should have your Hall Ticket bearing your roll number with you.
- **USING A PEN**, Write your name, hall ticket number and sign at the bottom of your answer sheet in the space provided. Shade in your hall ticket number into the oval boxes provided.
- For shading answers you are advised to use a pencil so that you can make corrections if any.
- Bring with you one or two HB pencils and an eraser since you will need a pencil to shade the correct answer on the answer sheet and if you make a mistake, you will need an eraser to erase the mistake.
- You will **NOT** be permitted to take rough paper, scale, calculators, slide rule, logarithm tables, drawing instruments, **CELLULAR PHONES** or pagers into the examination hall. Some sample questions from each of the various tests are given below. These cover the types of questions that will be asked. You will be given instructions for each type of question when you start a new section on the question booklet.
- There is no negative mark for wrong answers.

For the following question 5 separate answers are given. You are required to select the **ONE** correct answer:

1. Sulfosalicylic acid reagent is used for measuring
  - (A) Urine Urobilinogen
  - (B) C.S.F. Chloride
  - (C) Urine Bilirubin
  - (D) C.S.F. Protein
  - (E) Urine bile salts

(Correct answer D)

**Type – II**

In the following questions more than one answer may be correct. Select response:

- (A) If 1, 2 and 3 are correct
- (B) If 1 and 3 are correct
- (C) If 2 and 4 are correct
- (D) If only 4 is correct
- (E) If all are correct

2. Subarachnoid haemorrhage is confirmed by the following procedures

- 1. Plain X-ray skull
- 2. Pneumo-encephalogram
- 3. Myelogram
- 4. Lumbar puncture

(Correct answer D)

**Type – III**

In this section, a clinical vignette is followed by 2 to 3 questions and five answers for each (A,B,C,D, & E). You are required to select the ONE correct answer for each question.

A 21 years old male patient presents with 5 days history of fever, cough and chest pain. Illness started with cough and chest pain. On the second day he started expectorating viscid sputum. Temperature ranged from 100 - 104° F. B.P 110/80 mm Hg. There was no cyanosis. There were bronchial breath sounds over the right infra-scapular region with increase in voice conduction. Chest X-ray showed opacity in the right lower lobe, with no obliteration of the costophrenic angle.

3. Which of the following is the most likely diagnosis

- (A) Tuberculosis
- (B) Pneumococcal pneumonia
- (C) Lung abscess
- (D) Silicosis
- (E) None of the above

(Correct answer B)

4. Which of the following is the therapy to be given

- (A) Bed rest and streptomycin
- (B) Bed rest and penicillin
- (C) Streptomycin and P.A.S.
- (D) Bed rest and symptomatic treatment
- (E) None of the above
